What is this about?

- We are planning a research study with kids called **The Kid's Trial**.
- We need help planning our study and so we are asking kids to help us do this.
- The kids who help us plan **The Kid's Trial** will be members of our **CRAG**.

A CRAG is a group of kids who help us do research by telling us what they think.

Children- we're looking for kids between 7 & 12 years-old.

Research- an organised way we solve problems or find out facts about something.

Advisory- suggest ideas to find solutions to problems

Group- our group will be made up of about 8 kids

Why do we need help planning our project?

We think kids are experts on all kid-type things. Since our research project is being done for and by kids, we believe they should help us plan it too.

-That's why we need a **CRAG**-

What is research again?

- **Research** is an organised way to solve problems or find out facts about something.
- Sometimes in research we think of new ways to answer a question. This could mean we come up with a question, find a way we might answer or test our question, and do those tests.
- The type of research we are doing in **The Kid's Trial** is a randomised trial.

What is a randomised trial?

We are health researchers who focus on randomised trials.

- A randomised trial is a type of experiment that tests if something we do, like exercise, or something we use, like medicine when we are sick, makes a difference to our health.
- We call the things we test during the trial interventions or treatments.
- Mostly, researchers test the intervention by dividing people into groups randomly.
- One group in the trial gets the intervention or treatment, and the other group does not. After the trial is finished we look to see if the intervention made a difference to outcomes we are interested in.

Who are we asking to join the CRAG?

We are looking for about eight children who:

- are between 7 and 12 years old
- can speak and understand English well
- are interested in helping us make our trial better
- want to be part of a kid-led project

We will invite kids to be part of our **CRAG** depending on where they are from and if they want to join in. We want to include kids from all kinds of places and all kinds of families.

We also have a Parents' Research Advisory Group (PRAG) and if you'd like to join the CRAG, one of your parents/caregivers will need to join our PRAG.

What does joining the CRAG mean?

If you join the **CRAG** your job will be to:

- help us with our logo design
- help us come up with explanations about the project that make sense to kids
- tell us your ideas and opinions about our website
 - If you and your parent/caregiver agree you want to join, we'll send you more information about **The Kid's Trial** and when the **CRAG** will first meet.

How much time will being part of the CRAG take?

- The **CRAG** will meet about 6 times over the next 5 or 6 months.
- Each meeting shouldn't take us more than 45 minutes.
- All the meetings will be online over Zoom.
 - If you don't know how to use Zoom that's ok! We can show you.
- One of your parents or caregivers will join the first couple of meetings.
 - If after a couple of meetings you feel comfortable with the group, and your parent/caregiver agrees, you can join the meetings on your own.
- Sometimes we will ask you to think about something we send you before our meeting so everyone can come prepared.

What if I want to STOP ?



You don't have to join the **CRAG** and if you change your mind after you join, you can still stop any time and no one will be upset.

If you want to stop then just let us know- we're here to help!
