

CRAG Interview Schedule

Introduction, Assent & Getting Involved

1. **Warm-up Question:** How have you been? What has been happening in your life since we last spoke?
2. **Explanation & Assent:** Do you understand we're doing an interview today where I ask you questions and you tell me what you think honestly? We will not use your name, so no one will know who said what.
3. **Project Involvement:** How did you learn about joining the CRAG?

Prompt: Did you hear about it from your parent or online?

F/U: Can you tell me what you did as a CRAG member?

Experience & Feelings

4. **Learning Process:** Can you tell me what you learned from being part of the CRAG?

Prompt: Did you learn anything about research? Did you learn anything about trials? Did you learn anything about other people or other places?

F/U (follow-up): What do you think was the most important thing you learned?

5. **Feelings:** How did you feel about being a CRAG member?

Prompt: Did you feel you had an important role?

Did your feelings change over time?

F/U: Can you tell me an example of how your feelings changed?

6. Did you enjoy being part of the CRAG?

Prompt: Did you like working on the website or having the meetings?

F/U: What did you enjoy the most?

7. **Project Contribution:** What are you most proud of about your work?

F/U: Why are you proud of this?

8. **Project Compensation:** How did getting paid for your work make you feel?

F/U: Do you think you learned anything about paid work from being part of the CRAG?

Collaboration

9. **Team Interaction:** Can you tell me about a time when you worked together as a team with the other members of the CRAG, PRAG or your parent?

10. Did you think it was useful to have the grown-ups join us during some of the meetings?

F/U: Why or why not?

11. **Contribution and researcher interaction:** How did you share your ideas with me? Did you feel listened to? Did you ever not feel listened to by me?

F/U: Can you think of another way I should have asked for your opinions or ideas?

12. **Difficulties:** Were there any tricky or hard parts of being part of the CRAG or helping design the trial?

Prompt: Did you learn anything about health research or trials? Did you learn anything about your child?

F/U: What do you think was the most important thing you learned?

10. **Feelings:** How did you feel about being a PRAG member?

Prompt: Did you feel you had an important role?

Did your feelings change over time?

F/U: Can you tell me an example of how your feelings changed?

11. **Contribution:** What contribution do you think PRAG members made to The Kid's Trial?

F/U: Can you tell me what you think is the most important thing you did as a PRAG member?

12. **Child's Contribution:** What contribution do you think the CRAG members made to The Kid's Trial?

F/U: What do you think your child learned? Do you think this is important? Why?

Collaboration

12. **Team Interaction:** Can you think of a time when you worked together as a team with the other members of the CRAG or PRAG, including your child?

13. **Contribution and researcher interaction:** Was it useful to have the adults present during the first few meetings with the children and researcher?

F/U: Why or why not?

14. **Contribution and researcher interaction:** How did you share your ideas with me? Did you feel listened to? Did you ever not feel listened to by me?

F/U: Can you think of another way I should have asked for your opinions or ideas?
