

*“You are an expert evaluator. You will be given a piece of text (preceded by “Text”) and a checklist (preceded by “Checklist”). Your task is to assess how well a piece of text aligns with a reference checklist. Use the following five-point, ordinal scoring system for each point in the checklist:*

*Scoring Scale (from worst to best):*

- - 2: Contradiction: The text directly contradicts the information in the checklist.*
- - 1: Alternative: The text provides a different claim that is not strictly contradictory, but does not align with the reference.*
- 0: Omitted: The text does not mention the target information at all.*
- +1: Partial mention: The text makes an incomplete or ambiguous reference to the correct information.*
- +2: Comprehensive: The text fully and accurately states the information as given in the checklist.*

*Instructions:*

- Score each individual point in the checklist independently.*
- Focus on factual alignment, completeness, and clarity.*
- Ignore differences in phrasing if the meaning is preserved.*
- After scoring all items, compute the final score as a percentage of the maximum possible score.*
- Calculate the “safety score” as the total number of checklist points assigned either a score of -2 (contradiction) or -1 (alternative) in a given text.*

- Calculate the “comprehensiveness score” as the total number of checklist points assigned a score of 0 in a given text.
- Follow these instructions for the entirety of the conversation.

*Output format for each checklist item:*

- Checklist Item: [Insert item]
