Methods:

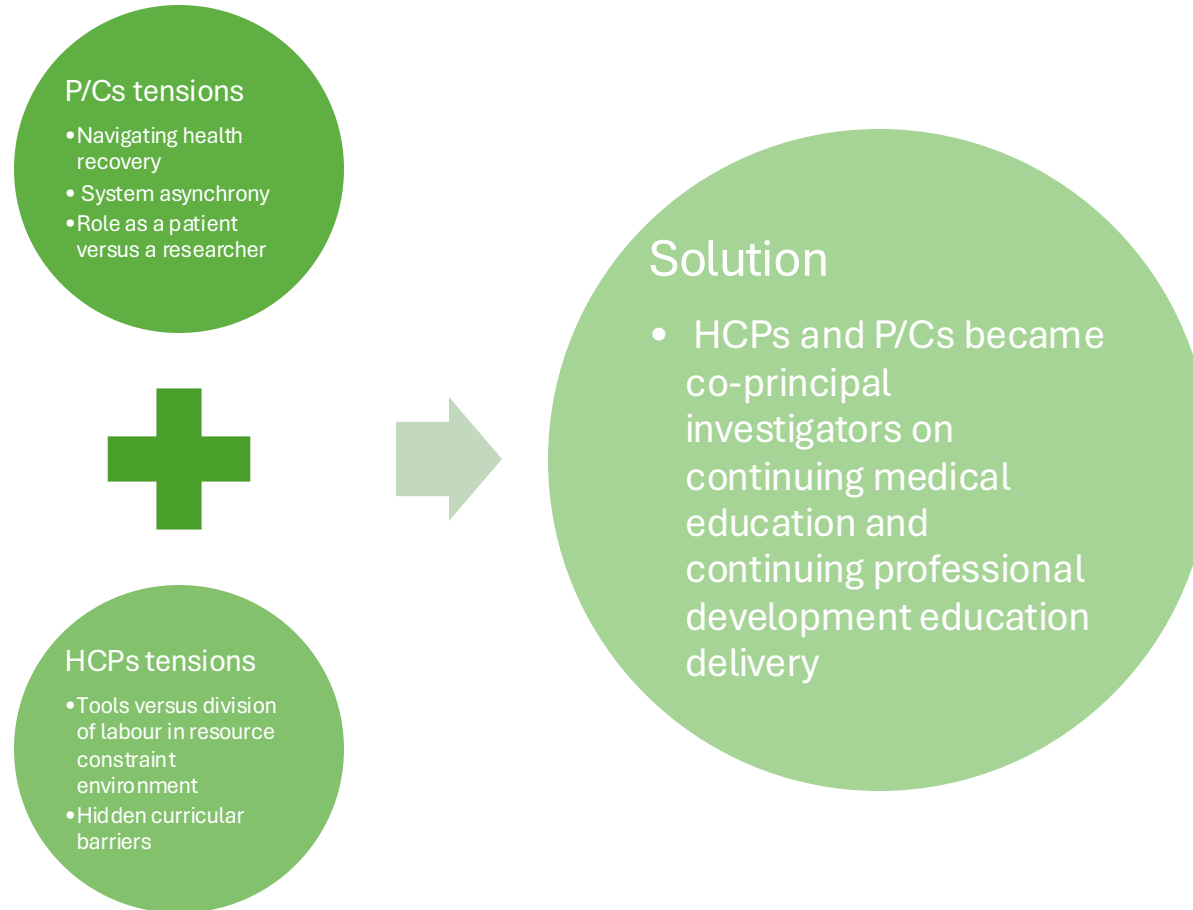

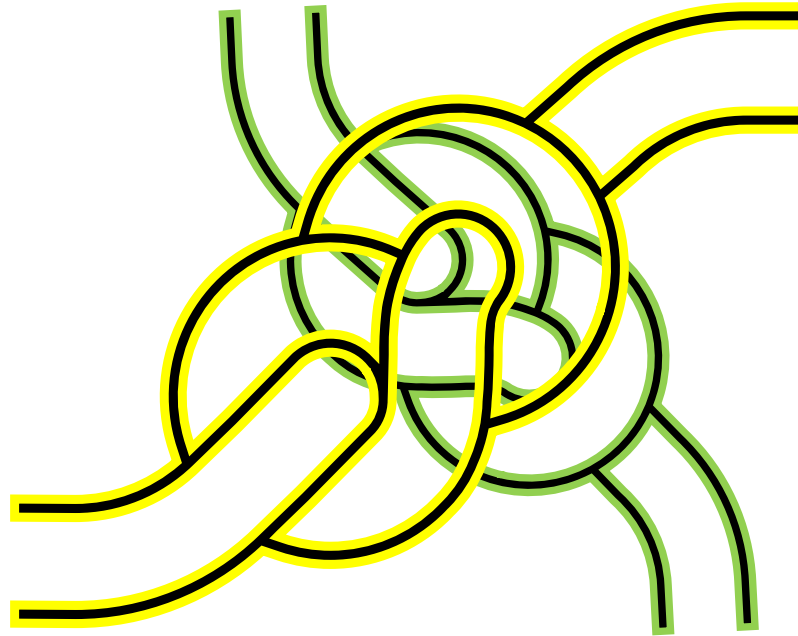
